North-Facing Houses

I've been living in a North-facing house for the last few months, which has been a great opportunity for me to experience and experiment with the Feng Shui of a new environment. This year, North-facing houses are facing 'The Grand Duke' which is the dominant direction of the year. When a building faces this energy, it is said to

oppose and offend The Grand Duke. This can therefore create instability, delays and obstacles in a building. This certainly lines up with my recent experiences! I also have a client who is building on a north-facing block and they have experienced a series of setbacks so far this year including an unusually high number of accidents and injuries on site. Where possible, try to keep the north sector of your home quiet and avoid renovating, building or extending in the direction of North.

Remedies for the Grand Duke

- Houses facing north with the front door also placed in the north sector, can use a Bagua Mirror with a concave mirror - this year only - place it above the entrance.

- The traditional Chinese remedy to appease The Grand Duke is a dragon head tortoise. Position it in the North sector of your home with the shell facing the north direction.

By now most people are familiar with The Secret and understand it's core teaching - 'The Law of Attraction'. When it comes to Feng Shui, I find it useful to think of your home as one big magnet that attracts certain experiences into your life.

How your building is oriented and when your house was first constructed determines the kind of energy present in a home and what themes may manifest in your life whilst living there. We ALL attract houses that resonate with us on some level and therefore unconsciously we choose to experience the challenges or harmony that the building offers. It's simple; your external geography is always a reflection of your internal geography. Your house reflects your life and your life reflects your house. Feng Shui, particularly Flying Star Feng Shui*, can be used as a tool to identify the energy that is working with you and against you and allows you align yourself with your environment in a way that can have a positive impact on your life.
